LECTURE AUGUST 21, 2008 ~ "SHORT ATTENTION SPAN QUILTING"



Linda Schmidt will present "Short Attention Span Quilting," included with this talk is more laughter, a few tears, a bit of poetry, and many thanks for the quilters who do traditional quilts so that I don't have to. Over 40 real quilts will be shown.

From Linda's website:

"I am a prolific quilter and garment designer, and have been learning about them, making them, and teaching about them for over 20 years, using almost every technique there is."

Workshop August 22, 2008 ~ "Threads At Play"

Threads at Play is the workshop for Friday, August 22. In this one-day version of Filament Fantasy, the student will jump right into doing appliqué, reverse appliqué, using decorative threads and decorative stitches, two threads through the same needle, using fused painted webbing and foil, doing cutwork and free motion embroidery on Solvy, and experimenting with various other techniques. This is a fast-paced workshop for the adventurous at heart, more of a process than a product class, and some techniques will be demonstrated only.

technique sharing workshops

We have had a great line-up of Technique Sharing Workshops (TSW's) this summer, thanks to all our great member-teachers: Barbara Youngblood, Phyllis Gallaway, Doris Maneke, Linda Morand, Marilyn Swanson and Mitzi Dowling.

Coming up September 4th, Juanita Campbell will teach us to make a SHEER HAWAIIAN WALL-HANGING with no needle-turn appliqué. This method uses organza over the specially cut traditional Hawaiian design so that no raw edges are exposed (you may download a supply list from the TSW page on the SRQG website or pick one up with a pattern from the TSW binder).

On September 18th, after the Founders' Day Luncheon, we can be inspired through CREATIV-ITY & MIND-MAPPING with Suzanne Havens (Sharon Fry's sister!). Suzanne explains, "Mind-mapping is great for brainstorming, whether you are problem solving for a new quilt, a quilt you've almost given up on, or a problem in everyday life." Bring a notebook or sketchbook, and a pencil!

TSW's are free and take place after most meetings, starting about 30 minutes after the regular meeting ends. Check out the TSW board at the back of the room for more information and to sign up for upcoming workshops. Most information is also on the TSW page on our website.

library news

I was recently chatting with one of our newer guild members about the library and was reminded about how much there is to learn about all that goes on at our guild. It can be overwhelming, but if one gives it a chance, it can be a wealth of information. As with any subject in life – don't hesitate to ASK for help when you are with fellow guild members. The person may know just what book you need, or how to baste a quilt, or how to make that delicious dessert you sampled from the buffet table (or may know the person to direct you to). Remember – we all had a first day (or first year, or first decade) at quilt guild!

Here are our newest books – with lots of dots and dashes in my typing. Yea – I passed high school English classes way back when, but this has become my style as I type those quick e-mails. Just fill in the blanks for me so that I can get back to reading those new books and maybe even find time to sew once in a while!

LOG CABIN QUILTS WITH ATTITUDE - A NEW TWIST ON AN OLD FAVORITE by Sharon V. Rotz - You are probably wondering if we don't already have enough books in our library about log cabin quilts, but when I saw the cover of this book I just knew we had to have it. I did judge the book by the cover, and I was very favorably rewarded. definitely putting an "*" next to this title on my book list. (By the way - I carry two hard copies of the library book list in my big guild bag, one alphabetized by title, the other author. Also, the lists are on the laptop computer that I set up at the back of the room. Everyone is invited to paw through the lists to help find just what we are searching for.) The cover quilt, titled "Freedom Quilt" is appropriately named as there are no seams to match. It is constructed of scraps, and the colors are rich and exciting. Some of the blocks start out with a triangle, or two halfsquare triangles, or a star, a rectangle, a flying goose unit, or another shape besides the usual square "chimney." I think this would make a great group project, or maybe a guild "Friendship Block" quilt. If you can get past the first quilt, then you will also find a "Patio Party" quilt featuring colorful lanterns hanging from woven ric-rack, tote bags, placemats, a "butterfly" pillow (you will have to check out the book to find out what this butterfly pillow is page 95) - and all with different color combinations to give you lots of ideas. When you check this book

out, be sure to return it to the next meeting as I am sure there will be a very long reserve list. In fact, a good policy – keep all the books circulating! There is no limit to the number of books you can check out – but please remember to return them at the very next meeting.



HAND-APPLIQUED QUILTS – Whimsical Designs & Simple Techniques by Tonye Belinda Phillips – Purchased for our library from the author (and autographed!), hot off the press, at Sisters, by Phyllis Gallaway.

ONE-PATCH QUILTS – A New Twist on One-Patch Piecing by Louisa L. Smith and Lisa Harris – Louisa, famous for her two books about Strips 'N Curves, entertained us at guild recently with her beautiful quilts. She has teamed up with her daughter to bring us a very different process from her other books. Once again, lovely quilts, but I warn you: NOT quick to make. This book also was picked up for us by Phyllis Gallaway, and she also had it signed.

THE ART & EMBROIDERY OF JANE HALL – Reflections of Nature by Jane Hall – Lynne Atkinson found this while cleaning out her large library. This is not technically a quilting book, but I am going to file it under "Embellishing" as it will give us ideas how to create beautiful fanciful butterflies, flowers, mermaids, fish, and more. Even if you never plan on embroidering, this book is absolutely wonderful to read and study the photographs of the beautiful projects. I would really like to meet the author as she must be a lovely person.

THE QUILTER'S CATALOG – A Comprehensive Resource Guide by Meg Cox – Melissa Trunick donated this brand new book to our library. I cannot believe all of the information that is included in just one book, and organized in an easy manner for quick reference. It is a book that could also be read from cover to cover by people new to the quilt world for a very fine education on the topic.

friendship blocks

We have a new friendship block to do! The block theme is "Birdhouses", for Marian Fryer. Using your preferred method of appliqué or piecing, create a house for your favorite feathered friend on a 100% cotton, off-white/beige background. The size can be anywhere from 6 ½ to 12 ½ inches square or rectangular, which ever you choose. To sign up for one of these fun blocks, come see me at the meeting for a list of instructions, or email me and let me know you would like to do one and get the instructions off of the Friendship Block page of our website.

We still have a few spaces left to do a "Sonoma County" themed block for Denise Raney and a "Star" block for Kathy Hannan. Also, I am accepting requests for blocks to be done.


I know we have a lot of new members, so I will briefly explain how the Friendship Block program works:

Anyone can make one of the requested blocks without further obligation to the program. Sometimes a certain theme will spark an idea and you want to make one, or you may like to try a new method without obligating yourself to a whole quilt, or perhaps one of your friends has requested a block and you would like to make it for that person. Making a Friendship block is also a fun way to get to know others in the guild.

To request a block to be made for yourself from others, you must first make 3 blocks for other participants. You are then eligible to submit a request for blocks to be made for you. A maximum of 20 blocks can be requested or received. The block recipient must payback into the program the number of blocks received. For example, a member makes 4 blocks for other people, then hands out block directions for themselves, they then owe 16 blocks back into the program. Once the blocks have been paid back, the member must make 3 more blocks before they are eligible to hand out a request for blocks again.

I am always happy to answer any questions you might have, or help you get started. Come see me at the meetings or contact me by email.


Library News continued

SUPER SIMPLE QUILTS WITH ALEX ANDERSON & LIZ ANELOSKI – 3 Quilts (in 3 Sizes), 1 Supply List – The title says it all! Also requested by Joanie Bellinghausen.

JELLY ROLL QUILTS – The Perfect Guide to Making the Most of the Latest Strip Rolls by Pam and Nicky Lintott – I have place an "*" on my master book list next to this title, not because it has any especially new or different techniques, but because this is going to be a valuable book on the bookshelf to flip through when one wants to make "something." The seventeen patterns are not new, but old favorites, and definitely not difficult, but look great. I really do not think that we have to start with purchased Jelly Rolls, but can collect strips of fabric from our own scrap boxes.


