Symmetry and Surprise with Paula Nadelstern

The workshop will be Inking Your Fabric. Textile inks have a wonderful range of applications in quilting. You will learn easy, effective shading and blending techniques in this workshop which can enhance your quilts and allow you to produce images of your choice. No sewing, a fun day of simple exercises on fabric. All skill levels are welcome.

Following Lura's directions anyone can be successful. The inks are provided, there is a \$10.00 fee per student, in addition to the class fee of \$30.00. Join us for the fun.



The quilts are of astonishing artistry, in extraordinary combination of color, pattern, and texture, with bold geometric shapes, dramatic shifts in scale, and an improvisational approach.

library news

Many quilters have admired our guild's TWO brand new Opportunity Quilts. I have had many questions as to how the border of the "Traditional" quilt was constructed. I found the original instructions in a March 1991 issue of Quilter's Newsletter Magazine (which our guild library does own). A brand new book by Jane Hardy Miller FRENCH BRAID QUILTS – 14 QUICK QUILTS WITH DRAMATIC RESULTS goes a step beyond this technique and has many very good looking variations.



If you plan to travel in California, Nevada, and/or Oregon check out the little green book called THE QUILTERS PATH. It is "a quarterly directory of quilting events, activities, and shopping opportunities to keep you in stitches."

Phyllis Gallaway suggested BEAUTIFUL QUILTAGAMI – NEW IDEAS FOR FABRIC FOLDING by Mary Jo Hiney. I have never encountered a folded fabric penguin before! Or an elephant!! And the butterflies are exquisite!!! These and many other folded designs may be added to such projects as quilts, pillows, totes, of which excellent instructions are included.

Barbara Youngblood has donated the American Quilters Society's newest book from their annual contest "New Quilts from an Old Favorite." I really enjoy this challenge and am always amazed at the unique designs that are created. This year is the DRESDEN PLATE.

Love the idea of growing flowers and/or vegetables, but have a brown thumb? Create them with fabrics instead with the help of Mickey Depre's GARDEN WHIMSY book. Her patterns and quilts are just a jumping off point for your very own quilts (or postcards!).

And if you have a great deal of patience you may wish to put together a garden of sunflowers, daffodils, bird-of-paradise, tulips, and 20 others with Linda Causee's 24 FLOWER QUILT BLOCKS – FULL-SIZE PATTERNS FOR FOUNDATION PIECING.

I have also picked up Linda Causee's 365 FOUNDATION QUILT BLOCKS. Some of the patterns that may be of interest are: darling pug, shamrock, the Eiffel Tower, a lily-of-the-valley, a mortar board for graduates, a partridge (California Quail), and even our Golden Gate Bridge!!! I can see one of the blocks as a starting off point for one of Phyllis Gallaway's "Add-A-Row" quilts.

Melissa Trunick has donated QUILT COLLECTION – A DELIGHTFUL COLLECTION OF OUR VERY FA-VORITE QUILTS AND GIFTS TO GIVE! by Gooseberry Patch (a Leisure Arts Publication). Chickens, stars, pumpkins, a flag, bears, a snowperson, and a pineapple block quilt are only a fraction of the motifs included to make into quilts, wall pieces, placemats, table runners, and knitting baskets.

An anonymous donation has brought us SULKY SECRETS TO SUCCESSFUL APPLIQUE by Joyce Drexler. If you have been wondering what the differences are in decorative threads and stabilizers, this is a must-see book. There is also a super little class in color theory.

Judy Sisneros has spoken at our guild twice. I had the privilege of getting to know her better when she stayed at our home for a long weekend. She is full of ideas and shares them with us in her newest book 9-PATCH PIZZAZZ – FAST, FUN & FINISHED IN A DAY. She calls this a beginner's book without that beginner's look. This book helps us when we have a favorite piece of fabric that is just too wonderful to cut up into small pieces as she shows us how to showcase that material with coordinating fabrics that are combined in nine-patches.

SURFACE APPLIQUE FOR QUILTING by Susan Cottrell – got ribbons, beads, threads, etc.? Turn them into embellished projects, such as book covers, purses, wall quilts. Love the crows!

DREAMING IN COLOR – 10 PATTERNS FOR TRADITIONAL, COLORFUL QUILTS by Sonia Brown

FAST, FUN & EAST FABRIC POSTCARDS – KEEPSAKES YOU CAN MAKE AND MAIL by Franki Kohler – more ideas for this very popular type of project

website news

Dear Quilting Friends,

There is wonderful feature on the recently updated SRQG website. It has an odd name: **The Blog**. I was totally unaware of how a Blog works until I started to use this one.

The guild site Blog operates a bit differently than a personal Blog. The web site
Blog is for <u>all members</u> of the guild to use for posting information related to guild activities and also to post any news items they may know about that they would like to share publicly with others on the website. http://www.santarosaquiltguild.org

Our website Blog is like an Internet message board in constant progress. You send me something you wanted posted on the Blog. I find a category to post it to and it's there for as long as needed for everyone to read and comment on. We have a lot of categories that apply to the various Blog messages, and I can add more as needed. If you missed reading something that was posted back in April, all the Blog entries are archived monthly. Click on April on the right side of the Blog page and you will see the entire postings for April.

Do you have something for sale? A new recipe that you would like to share? Do you know of some interesting website to visit? An upcoming quilt show or new quilt shop that we are unaware of? Are you looking for a special fabric that you need just a bit more of to complete a project? Do you have a new "quilting tool" we should know about? Does your guild committee need more help? Any upcoming sales at local quilt shop? Maybe you have pictures to share of your quilting space? Any new quilting tips or techniques? A new quilting book or pattern to tell us about? A new magazine you know about? Maybe you just want to chat about a new project you are working on? Maybe you have a question about a project you are working on? A quilt lecturer you heard? A class you are taking? A class you just completed? These are just a few of the many subjects that you could post on the Blog.

At this time I am literally the only person of over 200 guild members that has posted anything to the website Blog. As Webmaster. all Blog messages are initially sent to me, and then I post them onto the Blog for the membership. This is primarily done for web site security.

The Blog is, and could be a very useful website tool if members could be persuaded to use it on a regular basis. It is in essence a Message Board, and a wonderful way of communicating. Similar to an online message forum, you can also leave comments and questions. Any member can comment by clicking on "Comment" at the bottom of any message, scroll down and write their comment, and then click on "Submit Comment". The exchange of information starts there, and the possibilities are endless. I think it may take some time for the general membership to realize the usefulness of this wonderful feature of our Website. I would like to see it used to it's full potential in the future considering the time and expense that the guild has spent in the last year upgrading the website and adding this new feature. Please consider posting any guild or quilt related messages to the Blog! This could be the start of something interesting and fun for everyone!
