July Block of the Month
Due August 2, 2012



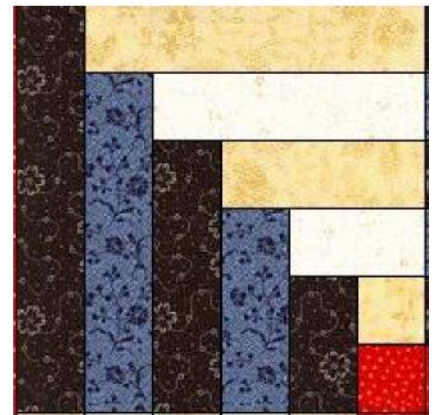
Note: This top requires two blocks.

You can make **Block 1** or **Block 2** or both!

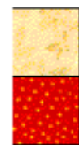
.This makes a 12-1/2 square unfinished block.

BLOCK 1 For one block you will need:

- 1 red 2 -1/2 inch square
- 1 tan 2 -1/2 inch square
- 1 dark blue 2 -1/2 x 4 -1/2 inch strip
- 1 cream 2 -1/2 x 4 -1/2 inch strip
- 1 medium blue 2 -1/2 x 6 -1/2 inch strip
- 1 tan 2 -1/2 x 6 -1/2 inch strip
- 1 dark blue 2 -1/2 x 8 -1/2 inch strip
- 1 cream 2 -1/2 x 8 -1/2 inch strip
- 1 medium blue 2 -1/2 x 10 -1/2 inch strip
- 1 tan 2 -1/2 x 10 -1/2 inch strip
- 1 dark blue 2 -1/2 x 12 -1/2 inch strip



Sew the red 2 -1/2 inch square and the tan 2 -1/2 inch square together.
Iron the seam toward the red fabric.



Sew the 2 -1/2 x 4 -1/2 inch dark blue strip on the left side. (Now
always press to the most recent addition.)



Sew the 2 -1/2 inch x 4 -1/2 inch cream strip to the top.



Sew the 2 -1/2 x 6 -1/2 inch medium blue strip to the left.



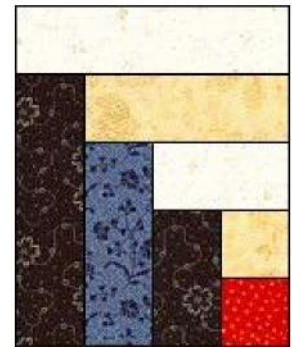
Sew the tan 2 -1/2 x 6 -1/2 inch tan strip to the top.



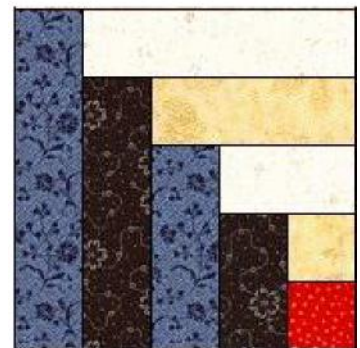
Sew the dark blue 2 -1/2 x 8 -1/2 inch strip to the left.



Sew the cream 2 -1/2 x 8 -1/2 inch strip to the top.



Sew the medium blue 2 -1/2 x 10 -1/2 inch strip to the left.

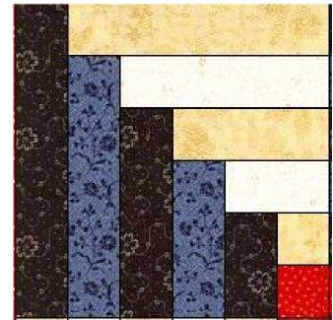


Sew the tan $2\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip to the top.



Sew the dark blue $2\frac{1}{2} \times 12\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip to the left.

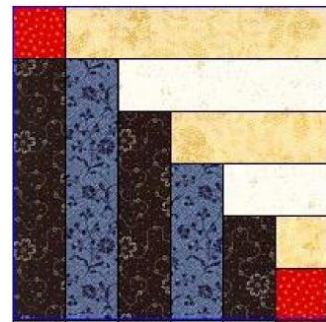
Your block should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ inches square.



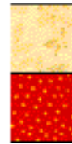
BLOCK 2:

For one block you will need:

- 2 red $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch square
- 1 tan $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch square
- 1 dark blue $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip
- 1 cream $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip
- 1 medium blue $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip
- 1 tan $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip
- 1 dark blue $2\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip
- 1 cream $2\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip
- 1 medium blue $2\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip
- 1 tan $2\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip
- 1 dark blue $2\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip



Sew the red 2 -1/2 inch square and the tan 2 -1/2 inch square together. Iron the seam towards the red fabric. (Always iron the seam towards the dark side.)



Sew the 2 -1/2 x 4 -1/2 inch dark blue strip on the left side.



Sew the 2 -1/2 inch x 4 -1/2 inch cream strip to the top.



Sew the 2 -1/2 x 6 -1/2 inch medium blue strip to the left.



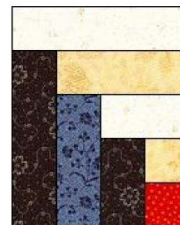
Sew the tan 2 -1/2 x 6 -1/2 inch tan strip to the top.



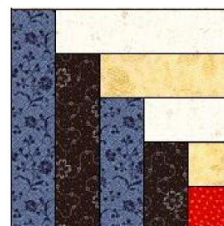
Sew the dark blue $2\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip to the left.



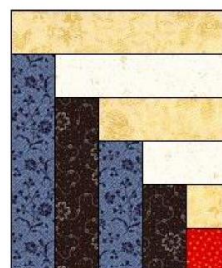
Sew the cream $2\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip to the top.



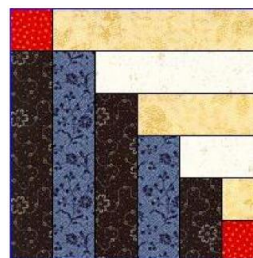
Sew the medium blue $2\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip to the left.



Sew the tan $2\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip to the top.



Sew the $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch red square to the $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch \times $10\frac{1}{2}$ inch dark blue strip. Sew this strip to the left of the block. Press toward the blue.



Here is how to sew them in rows.

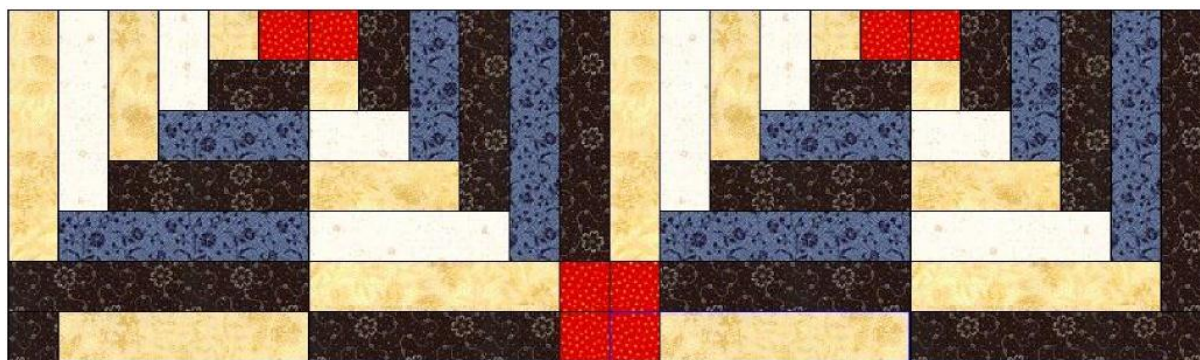
Row 1:

B1 B1 B1 B1



Row 2:

B1 B2 B2 B1



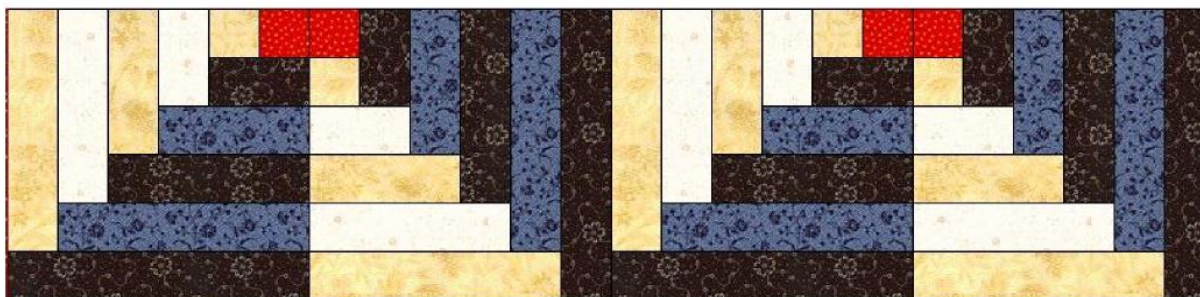
Row 3:

B1 B2 B2 B1



Row 4:

B1 B1 B1 B1
