

Block of the Month January 2009

The unfinished block will be $12\frac{1}{2}$ inches square

Use fabrics out of your stash to create this house and choose the colors that suit you best.



Background

- A- cut 2 pieces $5\frac{3}{4} \times 2$
- B- cut 2 pieces $3\frac{1}{4} \times 3\frac{1}{4}$
- C- cut 2 pieces $2\frac{1}{2} \times 5\frac{1}{2}$
- M- cut 1 piece $12\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{3}{4}$

Ground

- D- cut 1 piece $12\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{4}$

Roof

- E- cut 1 piece $12\frac{1}{2} \times 3\frac{1}{4}$

Chimney

- F- cut 1 piece 2×2

House

- G- cut 2 pieces $2\frac{1}{4} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$
- H- cut 1 piece $5\frac{3}{4} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$
- I- cut 1 piece $1\frac{3}{4} \times 3\frac{1}{2}$
- J- cut 1 piece $8\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$

Window

- K- cut 1 piece $2\frac{1}{4} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$

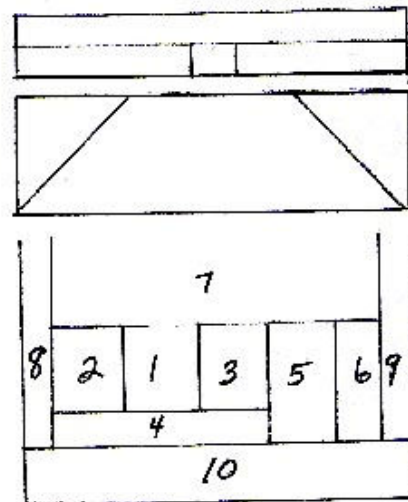
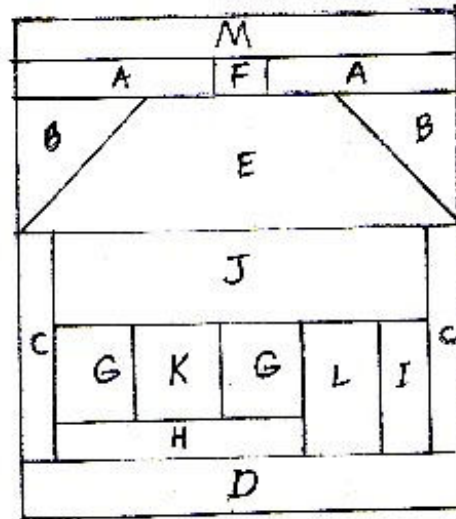
Door

- L- cut 1 piece $2 \times 3\frac{1}{2}$

This block is easily pieced in 3 sections as shown to the right.

For the roof section, place the 2 background sections **B** on top of roof **E** with right sides together and sew from corner to corner of **B** square. Trim excess fabric and flip.

Build the house as numbered with pieces 1 and 2 sewn on the $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch side, then sew all 3 sections together.
