
Linda would like her "Road to Heaven" block made with 2 bright colors and white as the background. It can be two shades of a single color, like medium and darker blue with white, or two totally different colors, like red and blue with white. You may use tone on tones, or prints small, medium or large, just so long as they are bright.






The block is 9" finished (9-1/2" unfinished)

The cutting guidelines use the half-square triangle (HST) method of sewing 1/4" on each side of the diagonal. There is no slush for oversizing/trimming down. (If you want to use a different method, figure your own cutting measurements: the HST units finish at 2-1/4", so they should measure 2-3/4" unfinished.)





Background: white Cut five 3-1/8" squares

Note: if using a different HST method, you will need your own cutting measurements for at least 3 of these.

Medium: color #1 Cut one 5-3/8" squares (cut once on diagonal)

Cut three 3-1/8" squares

Note: if using a different HST method, use your own cutting measurements for these 3 squares.

Dark: color #2 Cut four 2-3/4" squares

Step A: Make six HSTs with three of the 3-1/8" squares of the light and the medium. (If you want to oversize the units and trim them to the 2-3/4" unfinished size, cut the squares at 3-1/4".) Press toward the medium and trim "ears" off. Set aside 2 units for Step C.

Step B: Join four of the HSTs to the four dark squares as in the diagram, with the background fabric next to the square. Press toward the dark. Join two pairs to create Corner unit A/B. Press seams in one direction. Make two Corner A/Bs.

Step C: Cut remaining two light squares once on the diagonal. Using Step C illustration as a guide, sew one of these triangles to a HST. Press toward the light triangle. Trim the ear. Add the second light triangle. Press toward the light triangle. Trim the ear. With the newly pieced triangle on top, attach the medium colored large triangle (this will enable you to stitch precisely through the intersection of the small triangles.) Make two Corner C blocks.

Make top and bottom rows by rotating a Corner A/B to a Corner C until the center seams are opposing and matching the finished block illustration. Press toward Corner A/b.

Sew rows together. Press the final seam by <u>spiraling the intersection</u>. This block rotates to create a secondary pattern - it is important to spiral so the seams can nest.

Block should measure 9-1/2" (9" finished)
