LECTURE ~ "TIPS, TRICKS AND OTHER STUFF"




On Feb 21, we are fortunate to have Mickey Depre coming from the Chicago area. She is a nationally recognized quilt artist, author of *Garden Whimsy Quilts*, has contributed to many quilting magazines, and has had her work included in many quilt books, e.g., *Shoreline Quilts*, *Great American Quilts*, and *All American Quilts*. Mickey's work mixes traditional quilting techniques with bold, innovative machine appliqué and threadwork. Her images are meant to spark thought and a smile. Mickey will be entertaining us with her program, *"Tips, Tricks, and Other Stuff"* which features a trunk show and movie demos of various techniques, including her version of machine appliqué, bind-

WORKSHOP ~ "PAINTSTIKS"

The Feb. 22 workshop is "*Paintstiks—Make Any Fabric Your Own*" during which Mickey will teach fabric embellishment with Shiva oil paintstiks and rubbing techniques. Students will create their own unique fat quarters of fabric. The kit fee of \$27.50 includes seven fat quarters of various fabrics, including hand dyes and specialty fabric, and access to more than one hundred rubbing templates and seventy five to one hundred paintstiks for class use. This is a wonderful opportunity at the bargain price of \$35.00 plus the kit fee of \$27.50.





community guilts



Next up, on February 21st, Pam Beebe will help us learn HOW TO KNIT BABY CAPS, like the ones we donate to the hospitals for newborns. Bring a skein of baby yarn (not wool) and 4 double-pointed needles in size 5 (or size 6 if you knit very tightly).

On March 6, bring your sewing machines and prepared fabric for Melissa Trunick's MYSTERY QUILT. I can't wait for this one! You'll be able to pick up the supply list and cutting instructions on Feb. 21, or get it from our new TSW page on the SRQG website after that date. library news

I have so many terrific books to tell you about, I will just jump right in ~~~

Phyllis Gallaway helped me obtain books from our recent speaker Nancy Brenan Daniel to add to the two already in our library ROTARY HEIRLOOM QUILTS and SLICE'EM & DICE'EM QUILTS). They are all autographed. Our new acquisitions by Nancy are: 101 APPLIQUE BLOCKS, DISAPPEARING NINE-PATCH QUILTS, and LOG CABIN FLOWER QUILTS. If you missed Nancy's talk remember you can go to our website <u>www.santarosaquiltguild.org</u> and click on the Show and Tell chapter to see photos of some of Nancy's beautiful pieces.

Pam Brown asked if I would obtain WONDERFULLY WHIMSICAL QUILTS – 10 PLAYFUL PROJECTS TO MAKE YOU SMILE by Carol Burniston. I can't guess which quilt caught her eye – the "happy cats" on the cover, the "tall flamingos and palm trees," the "party fish," the funky, fluffy "sheep in dreamland," "liberty's" unique flag and star pattern, or maybe the "hot tamale sunflowers," or one of the many others. Fast, fusible appliqué is the key to finishing these quickly (or apply the old-fashioned method of appliqué – you choose).

SCULPTED THREADS – ARTFUL BROOCHES, EAR-RINGS, AND MORE by Janet Shipley Hawks features projects made out of <u>thread</u> and water-soluble stabilizer – no fabric! I can see some very interesting gift possibilities, as well as items for our Boutique sales!

CUTTING-GARDEN QUILTS – FABULOUS FUSIBLE FLOWERS by Melinda Bula uses a "paint-by-number" process to create beautiful roses, pansies, clematis, coneflowers, and apples. Once the method is understood for choosing fabric colors, dig into your collection of favorite flowers and fruit photographs and design your own masterpieces. The method uses fast fusibles. Studying the numerous pictures of the author's projects will give us ideas for "painting with thread" to add extra details and dimension to our guilts.

ACCIDENTAL LANDSCAPING – SURPRISINGLY SIMPLE QUILTED SCENES by Karen Eckmeier (autographed)~~ Last May while my sister was visiting I presented at a guild meeting a little wall quilt that I had made for her new home from Karen's first book HAPPY VILLAGES. I was really excited when I learned that Karen had put out a second book. These little picture quilts are fast and easy. No need to go to the fabric shop – dig into your collection for those little pieces of fabrics. And with the leftovers from the landscape projects, make smaller landscapes and/or bookmarks or postcards! I could go on and on about this book – but check it out and see for yourself – then go have FUN!

DESIGNING PATCHWORK ON YOUR COMPUTER – 100 PATTERNS AND TEMPLATES ON CD by Carol Phillipson. I have to admit that I had trouble following the simple-looking directions. I am sure I am missing just one really basic step. So, when one of you computer whizzes figures this book out, please come visit me and give me a lesson, which I will promise to pass on to another quilter! I will be curious who can figure this out first, so please e-mail me and give me your thoughts on this book.

ABCs OF LONGARM QUILTING by Patricia C. Barry – I had our brand new guild Treasurer, Jan Head, take



a sneak-peak at this book as she has a longarm quilting business (and does BEAUTIFUL work!!!). Jan wrote me a few notes about the book, and I concur with her thoughts: 1. Great tips if considering starting a business or building a business; 2. Good for those who just want to understand what longarm quilters do, and what they might ask you when you commission them to quilt a piece for you. The author includes a few projects to practice quilting (longarm or your home machine), including a tote bag and a super looking quilt carrier bag – both nice for yourself, or to make for our Boutique sales!

UNCOVERINGS 2007 – VOLUME 28 OF THE RE-SEARCH PROJECTS OF THE AMERICAN QUILT STUDY GROUP, free each year with our dues to that organization

HAPPY HOUR – RELAX AND ENJOY by Terry Atkinson – At our December meeting our new Treasurer Jan Head wowed us with a great looking quilt that she made in a super short amount of time, so of course, we just have to have a copy of the book in our library. Also patterns for table runners, pillows, and a cute tote bag!

THREAD CALLIGRAPHY – USING ZIGZAG STITCH AND A REGULAR SEWING MACHINE – NO NEED TO AD-JUST THE WIDTH OF THE ZIGZAG TO MAKE THE THICK & THIN LOOK OF CALLIGRAPHY (my review was easy – just read the title!) by Nancy Kazlauckas – Marilyn Altenbach saw this in the December issue of Quilting Arts magazine and thought we should give it a try.

STRIP CLUBBING – FAST AND EASY QUILTS WITH 2-1/2 INCH STRIPS by Daniela Stout, Georgette Dell'Orco, Susan Ziegler, and SHARYN CRAIG (a recent speaker!) – now we know what to do with those "jelly rolls" that are being sold in shops and in catalogs.

WATERCOLOR LANDSCAPE QUILTS – QUICK, NO-FUSS "FOLD & SEW" TECHNIQUE by Cathy Geier (a replacement for a lost copy)

PATCHWORK PICNIC – QUILTS AND RECIPES FOR YEAR-ROUND ENTERTAINING by Suzette Halferty and Nancy J. Martin (a replacement for a lost copy)

QUILTING FOR SHOW – A PRACTICAL GUIDE TO SUC-CESSFUL COMPETITION QUILTING by Karen McTavish – What are the secrets to winning blue ribbons on quilts? Karen has interviewed the best of the best (such as Caryl Bryer Fallert, Diane Gaudynski, Ricky Tims, Hollis Chatelain, Pepper Cory, Helen Squire, and more), plus show judges, and an AQS certified appraiser, and assembled the
