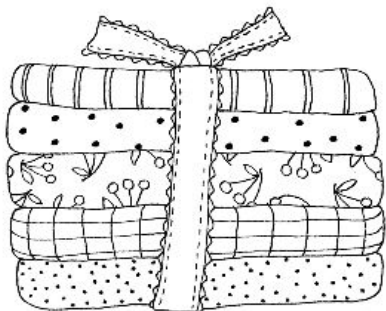




## president's message

**PROGRAM JANUARY 21, 2010 ~ LINDA BALLARD "DISCOVER THE POSSIBILITIES"**

January's guest speaker is the fabulous Linda Ballard! I can't wait to meet her; so many of you have wonderful things to say about her. Linda will show us how to look at a quilt and "Discover the Possibilities" to make it come true. If you have ever looked at a quilt and wondered "How did they do that?" or "What are the components?" or "How could I piece it?" Well, you will get answers from Linda as she describes her process.

"The Big Easy" is based on a traditional block but has been updated with a few newer techniques for construction. Linda Ballard's workshops are always so much fun, and you always learn a trick or two for easier construction. This scrappy pattern makes a really fun quilt - which you may choose to make in one of three sizes, or choose your own size - or even just make one block as the center of a medallion quilt or a pillow.

## coming in february

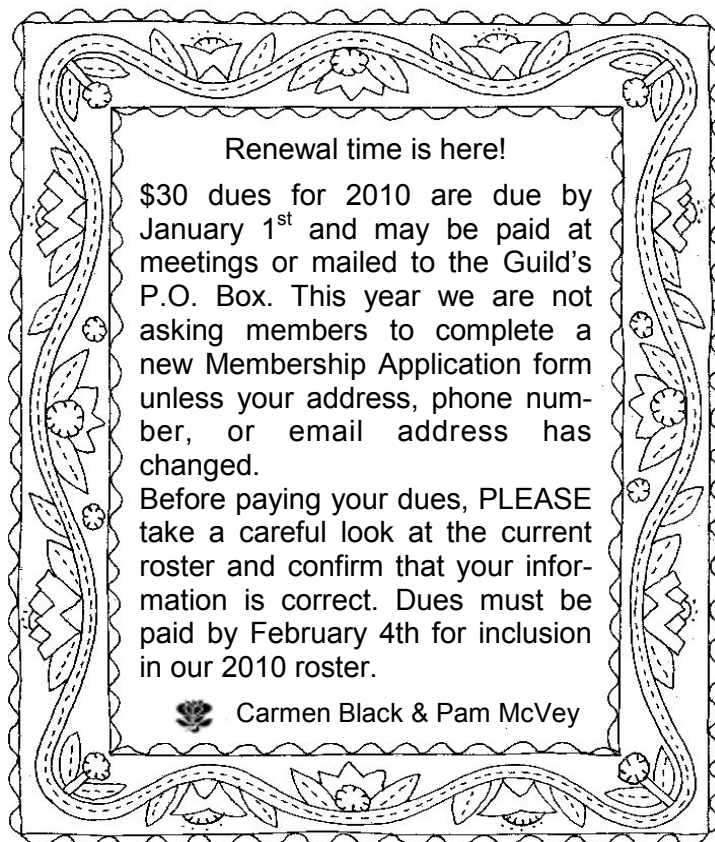
February's guest lecturer is Julie Hirota, author of Art Glass Quilts. Julie's lecture is entitled "All About Balance."

I just love having a quarterly drawing for those who turn in a friendship block during the quarter. (Just a little motivator !)

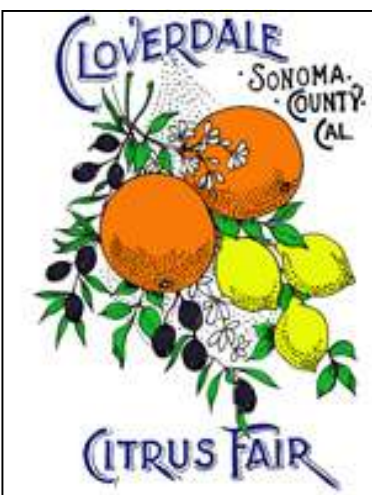
Thank you to all who participated last year. I loved every block !

## technique sharing workshops

You are welcome to attend any or all Technique Sharing Workshops (TSW's for short), which are free short classes, taught by guild members, held after lunch at many guild meetings. Coming up:

**January 7th**, bring your sewing machine to learn how to *chain piece a whole baby quilt top* together quickly and easily, starting with just one stack of squares. Pam Beebe will walk us through the steps, and having your machine will really help your learning! You can apply this great technique to easily sew blocks together for any top you make, starting with them all in one stack!

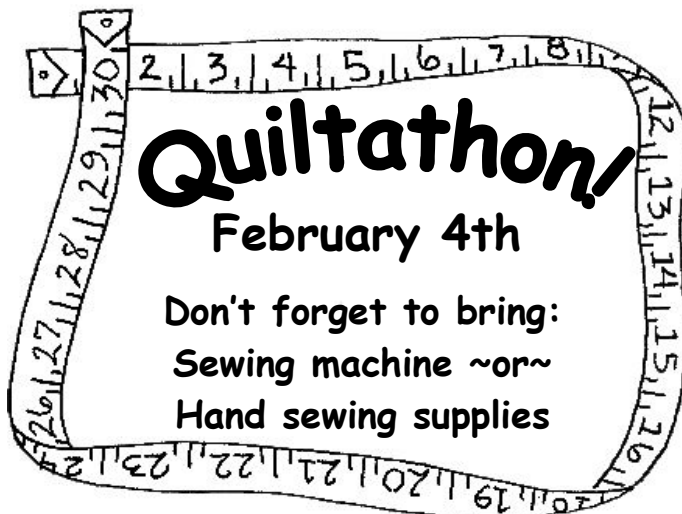
**January 21st**, we have a 2-part TSW with Jan Head. First, learn *how to apply borders* so all your quilts and community quilts will be square and flat. No more "friendly" borders that "wave" at you! Second, Jan will teach us how to *prepare our quilts for long-arm quilting*. Many long-arm quilters charge extra (because of the extra time needed) for fixing issues which are easily done by you beforehand. Learn to avoid these extra costs and any delay in having your quilt finished.

**February 18<sup>th</sup>**, join Diana Roberts to learn *how to make yo-yo's*, using the old-style method and the new yo-yo makers. Diana will also demonstrate some fun things to do with yo-yo's.

**March 4**, learn from June Moes how to *"mark" your quilts like the Victorians did* using blue line waste canvas, embroidery floss and cross stitch. June's technique was featured in Jean Ray Laury's book "Creating Body Coverings" in 1974. June will supply the materials.

# Quilting on the Web



**Listen to Music from all over the world while you sew; plus Amish Quilts find a home.**

I love to listen to music when I machine quilt and after a while I had heard all my albums at least 10 times each. Then I discovered **iTunes Internet Radio** on my computer. I was familiar with iTunes from my son downloading songs onto his iPod. I have so many albums in LP, cassette format and CDs, why would I want to pay for more songs? So free Internet radio is a boon! The iTunes program can be downloaded for free in a version for Mac or for Windows. Go to <http://www.kqed.org/radio/listen> and then scroll down to the section that says "Download free audio players" and follow the directions for your computer. When the iTunes window appears look on the left under LIBRARY and scroll down to Radio. Click on radio and you will have a choice of types of stations available from Adult Contemporary, Classical, Classic Rock, Sports, Talk, Oldies, Country and many, many more. Click on the triangle and the stations appear. There are over 61 streams available just for Classical music that include an all opera sta-

tion, a station for Canadian composers, new electronic music from San Francisco and my favorite, a classical station from Venice, Italy. My husband ran a wire from my computer, which is in one bedroom, to speakers in my sewing room so I can listen while I sew.

*I find that Mozart is best to listen to when sewing feathers.*

Julie Silber, the quilt historian and past curator of the **Esprit Collection** of Amish Quilts has spoken to SRQG several times. She and her partner, Jean Demeter, have a web-based antique quilt business, The Quilt Complex located in beautiful Albion on the Mendocino coast. When you go to the short slideshow video with musical accompaniment by quilter Joe Cunningham appears, showing highlights of the original Esprit Collection with an analysis of the quilt patterns. Eighty-two of the Lancaster Amish quilts of the original 300 quilts in the Esprit Collection were saved from being dispersed to private collections when, now divorced owner, Doug Tompkins, sold the quilts in 2002 for one million dollars to the Heritage Center Museum of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. They are now exhibited on a rotating basis at the Lancaster Quilt and Textile Museum. Some of the remaining quilts are for sale from Julie if you would like one of your own.

## community smart card

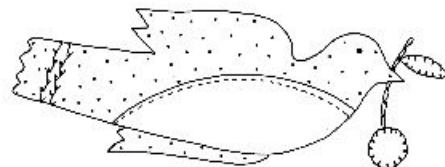

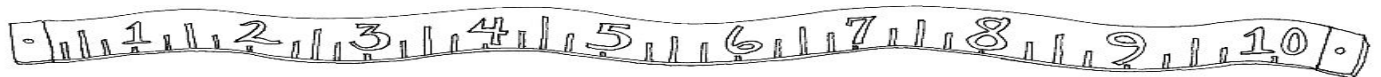
