- Pam Brown noted that the Moonlight Quilters need volunteers for the show on June 1st and 2nd, in all areas. Pam has clipboards with different jobs, dates and times. SRQG members who sign up for 2 shifts of 2 hours each will receive free admission to the show for both days and access to the hospitality room. Members will be contacted by Katina Repp in May regarding their assignments.
- Norma Viglienzone made a few announcements regarding the Tri-Guild Luncheon. She
 asked that table hostesses check in with her just prior to seating and to please bring a 1
 cup measuring cup instead of a ladle. The doors open at 8:30 and Table hostesses
 should be there at 9:30 as the guests will start arriving at 10:00.
- Lynne Atkinson is excited by the response to Marjan Kluepfel's dyeing class on Tuesday, June 4th at Luther Burbank Art and Garden Center. - Joy McGoran explained the Sewing Room Sale and asked if members were interested. There was enough interest, so Joy will organize the sale for August 1st and have signups at the next meeting.
- Sharon Cahn of Pluckings announced her show and opening reception at McCree-Goudeau Gallery in Vallejo. She has flyers and a notice is in the newsletter.

Committee Reports

- Friendship Blocks—Phyllis Gallaway noted that blocks are down to a trickle and displayed several blocks. Three more new blocks for Community Quilts will be coming soon. Several blocks still have openings, and she reminded members to turn in their blocks in a timely fashion. Members turned in 183 blocks in the first 3 months of 2013.
- TSW—Phyllis G. reminded members to sign up for TSWs in the folder at the back of the room, as it helps her prepare the appropriate number of handouts. Jan Head will be demonstrating "Really Skinny Border Accents à la Sally Collins" today. In May, Carolle LeMonnier will show her prairie point placemats, with printed foundations that will be available for \$1.25 each. She advised members to note how many foundations they would like when they sign up and that the fee may be paid to Carolle on the day of the TSW. Linda Hooper will present a mystery quilt on June 6th. At this time, fabrics required are a light, medium and dark. June 20th, Chris Nolen will demonstrate making pet beds for the Humane Society. Both the frame and cover will be demonstrated.
- Tri-Guild Luncheon—Genelle Voorhees and Alana Colburn thanked everyone for the items submitted for the raffle baskets.  row two to row three. Ellindale displayed several projects and invited members to sign
 up at the Sew-A-Row display at the back of the room. Chris Nolen noted that Sew-ARow is a good way to try a new technique without having to make a huge project.
- Challenge 2013—Elizabeth Marrs and Shirley Ziolkowski reminded members about the Apron Challenge due in August. They noted that anything goes and that the Bennett Valley Gals are working on some nice prizes.
- Community Quilts—Anne Dondero announced that Meg Easter-Dawson from Valley of the Moon Children's Home will be here soon to make a presentation and pick up the 100 quilts after the quilt parade. A work party will be held at Pam Beebe's home on Thursday the 11th with a focus on layering to get ready for the Quiltathon in May.
- Programs and Workshops—Gail Alford and Alana Colburn announced that Gayle Bong will be presenting a workshop on her ThirtySomething ruler on May 17th. Thus far, only 3 people are signed up and we have passed the 30 day deadline for cancellation. Chris Nolen plugged the class and noted that we cannot continue to host classes that lose money and that losses now will result in programs being cancelled later this year. Other members noted that it is s good way to meet other members and get to learn a new technique all at the same time. - Sharon Fry presented several new books and magazines from the Library.
