Guidelines:

- Make a starter row 12"-36" wide (mini's are great, too). Please no wider than 36".
- Place it in a bag with at least 1/4 yard of some of the fabrics used in the row to help with continuity.
- Submit to Jan Andrews at any meeting by December 6. (Or make arrangements with me)

Ideas:

- Holiday themes (These get filled quickly)
- Baby and kid-friendly quilts
- Machine embroidery

If you have any questions please contact me, I'd love to have you join in the fun and I'd like to get at least 25 more rows.

Some people wish for a long-arm quilting machine – I wished for – and RECEIVED-- a long-arm stapler! Every once-in-a-while a library book or magazine will need some surgery that my regular desktop stapler could not handle. Thanks to our talented, generous, very efficient Recording Secretary, Doris Maneke, our library now has adopted and made a new home for this very helpful tool. If you ever notice one of your own books needing assistance, or have other little projects that require such a device, bring it to guild! It takes regular staples. Thanks, Doris!

This may be the shortest library newsletter I have ever written! There are very few new books to purchase right now because the publishers are waiting to introduce quilting books at the Houston show. So, today is a bit of a vacation day for me.

FUN WITH ONE BLOCK QUILTS – 12 PROJECTS IN MULTIPLE SIZES FROM 1 SIMPLE BLOCK by Cheryl Malkowski uses a simple triangle to make "Y" blocks for complicated-looking projects, including the very popular table runners. Twisting and turning the blocks can create stars, pinwheels, windmills, and more designs. Others have addressed "Y" triangle blocks before, but this author has figured out how to make them so that the seams nest together cozily. If you, like so many of your fellow guild members, are have trouble making that perfect 1/4 inch seam allowance, check out page 5

SIMPLE CHENILLE QUILTS – BLOCK BY BLOCK – REVERSIBLE! by Amy Whalen Helmkamp is a little different from our other chenille books because these projects are done in small parts that are then sewn together for the final size. It is also different because the author shows how to add "soft-edgeapplique." And it is different because of the reversible technique. The techniques are easy, but I must warn you – you are encouraged to use UNwashed fabrics for the best success for making the blocks fuzzy and fluffy. Amy does include hints for purchasing products to have on hand in case the fabrics run. You definitely do take a chance with bleeding fabrics, but maybe it will add a different effect to your project.

With over 1900 books in our library we are very creative in storing them. If you do not see what you wish on the cart, be sure to ask someone in the library corner to show you our two cabi-



nets full of books plus the cupboard that stores our magazines. Don't forget that we have a laptop computer that was very generously donated by Jan Andrews set up in the back of the room to help figure out if we have the book you are looking for.

Check out lots and lots of books – and bring them back at the very next meeting --- pleeeeeeeze.
