Each signature space was sold for \$1. –except for the special signatures which we requested from teachers, lectures and dignitaries. Blocks were made and names embroidered by members.

About 1985 it was decided the quilt should be hand quilted and retained by the guild. It was basted by members, the center portion put on a frame located at Quilter's Quarters, (a quilt and fabric store in Sebastopol), so members could go there and quilt. The borders were basted separately and quilted by member Lois Stephens, and attached by Gene Isaacs and bound by Wyn Reddall. Many signatures were embroidered by Mildred Guthrie.



Luther Burbank Wall Quilt - 1986

Made to commemorate the Guild's 10th Anniversary and as a gift to the Luther Burbank Home and Garden, Santa Rosa. It hung in the museum carriage house for approximately 10 years.

Fabrics for the lattice and background were donated by New York Fabrics store.

The committee included Vernice Thorn who designed the overall layout pattern and used the design of the four architectural pieces from a design on one of the doors, and drew the four designs to scale. Judy Markoff drew the Burbank profile, and along with Jeanette Hinton worked with Vernice to choose the colors and other designs to be used. Members were asked to supply designs and fabrics and did the applique, hand quilting and embroidery.

The four architectural designs surrounding the profile include Burbank's residence, his greenhouse and the front gate. This entire complex is now owned by the City of Santa Rosa.



Santa Rosa Quilt Guild Banner - 1986

The rose design was originally designed for use as a logo for the 1983 Festival of Quilts and later adapted for a banner design, and is also used on the Guild stationary, by Ed Gross, Mill Valley, CA.

The rose was stitched by Vernice Thorn, lettering by Betty Thorn and quilted by members with additional quilting added in 1987 by Vivian Danz.

This banner is currently displayed at our Guild meetings at the Scottish Rites Center in Santa Rosa.
